District Web Filtering Information, provided by JP Pontius, Provo City School District Technology Department

Web Filtering of District Devices

Web filtering should never replace supervision and education. All three are needed to protect kids online.

What filters are being used in Provo City School District and how do they work?

Provo City School District uses the same filter most districts in the state use, Iboss Web Filtering appliances and cloud nodes. Our filter is currently configured to block the following categories:

- Adult Content, Sexually Explicit Content, Child Pornography, Pornography, Explicit Art, Nudity, Obscene, Tasteless, and R Rated content.
- Security: Bad Reputation Domains, BotNet, Hacking, Malicious Code, Virus, Phishing, Spyware, Peer-to-Peer/Filesharing and Web-based Proxies/Anonymizers.
- Gambling
- Illegal/Questionable: Criminal Skills, Violence and Hate
- Illegal Drugs, School Cheating, Terrorist/Militant/Extremist
- Alcohol
- Tobacco
- All other CIPA compliant categories as required.

Exception Categories

- Education Material: Material under another category that has educational value (such as classic literature, sex education, etc.)
- Whitelisted sites

Some students are placed on more restricted access depending on need. These include whitelist only and denied access to Youtube or other apps.

Youtube is forced to restricted mode for devices checked out to students. Youtube restricted mode is the default for on-prem connected devices.

Google search is results are forced to safe search content for on and off-prem student accounts.

All sites not in an Iboss filtering category are not allowed.

What resources does the district use to educate students on safe Internet use and digital citizenship?

What is the protocol in district schools when inappropriate content is accessed by students?

An Internet usage report is sent to the principal or site administrator. Detailed information about the device used and any user account information is provided to assist in the investigation process. Instruction is given to contact the parent or guardian of the student.
