### **Safe Walking Routes**

Kim sent the following message to Alex Judd, Assistant Superintendent of Elementary Education.

The Westridge Community Council met last week to discuss Safe Walking Routes. There are a lot of concerns about 1460 West (the road in front of the school) as well as 1500 West/1550 West. The Westridge Community Council recommendations regarding Safe Routes to school for 2022 include the following:

A. Install painted lines, along 1550 West/1500 West between 1460 North and the south edge of the hill, which will identify a center lane, bike lanes, and parking lanes.

B. Install speed bumps (i.e., like Palisade Drive and Carterville Road) to slow down the traffic on 1550 West/1500 West between 1460 North and the south edge of the hill., as well as along Grand Avenue.

C. At the corner of 1460 North and 1500 West install a four-way stop following recommendations from BikeWalk Provo for setting the stop for cars back far enough so cars can see pedestrians and bicyclists.

D. Install two speed indicator signs (i.e, like the indicator signs on Sandhill Road) on 1460 North for the westbound traffic approaching Westridge Elementary School and for eastbound traffic approaching Westridge Elementary School.

#### Goals & Funding for 2022-2023

Our goal for the 2022-2023 school year is 80% of Kindergarten through 6th-Grade students will make typical or above progress on the Acadience Pathways of Progress (POP) End of the Year (EOY) assessment. The Acadience assessment helps teachers determine how students are performing on important reading skills. These critical reading skills include phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, and comprehension.

Our goal for the 2022-2023 school year is that students in 3rd through 6th-Grade will increase their math scores by 3%, and students in 4th through 6th-Grade will increase their science scores by 5% as measured by the end of year SAGE/RISE test data.

Funding Total: \$87,851.51

Para-educators will provide remediation and extensions for our Kindergarten through 6th-grade students.
