Trustland Plan for the 2024-2025 School Year Ideas

• Goals

Since Acadience is a district and school-wide focus, we would like to continue having an Acadience goal. Continue to focus on Pathways of Progress since it measures individual students' growth. Continue at 80% until there are two consistent years of reaching that goal, and then consider increasing the percentage. Everyone made the 80% goal last year. We will see what happens this year. Since RISE is a state, district, and school-wide focus, we would like to continue to have a RISE goal. Continue the 3% increase for math until we achieve that goal. Drop the science goal to 3% so it is consistent with math. Once we have more information about Acadience Math, consider adding a goal in that area the following year for consistency across Acadience.

• Funding

Instructional Assistants are needed for intervention and extension work with students. They help teach our research-based interventions or take groups so the teachers can teach the interventions. Continue to use Trustland money to hire interventions for Kindergarten to 6^{th} grade.

Find ways to increase the volunteers at Westridge to also help with student intervention. Advianne suggested a program called RSVP, which is a "senior" volunteer program. Look at ways to incentivize people to volunteer- Free Wildcat T-Shirt. Amber liked the idea but wants to hire Instruction Assistants for interventions due to consistency issues with volunteers.

Goals & Funding for 2023-2024

Our goal for the 2023-2024 school year is 80% of Kindergarten through 6th-Grade students will make typical or above progress on the Acadience Pathways of Progress (POP) End of the Year (EOY) assessment. The Acadience assessment helps teachers determine how students are performing on important reading skills. These critical reading skills include phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, and comprehension.

Our goal for the 2023-2024 school year is that students in 3rd through 6th grade will increase their math scores by 3%, and students in 4th through 6th grade will increase their science scores by 5% as measured by the end of year RISE test data.

Funding Total: \$93,839.72 Use of Funds: Para-educators will provide remediation and extensions for our Kindergarten through 6th-grade students
