Trustland Plan Proposal for the 2024-2025 School Year Goals:

- 80% of Kindergarten through 6th-Grade students will make typical or above progress on the Acadience Pathways of Progress (POP) End of the Year (EOY) assessment. The Acadience assessment helps teachers determine how students are performing on important reading skills. These critical reading skills include phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, and comprehension.
- Students in 3rd through 6th grade will increase their math scores by 3% as measured by the end-of-year RISE test data.
 - o Tracking of students across grade levels
 - o Perry Closing the gap is happening
- Students in 4th through 6th grade will increase their science scores by 3% as measured by the end-of-vear RISE test data.
 - o Tracking of students across grade levels

The council agrees with the above goals.

Funding Total: \$93,839.72 for 2023-2024 school year

• Para-educators will provide remediation and extensions for our Kindergarten through 6th-grade students.

Cameron - What do teachers need most?

Amber - Para-educator support so teachers can pull small groups and do teacher-led interventions. Perry - We want to create a plan that gives the school ultimate flexibility to do what is needed for the students.

The council agrees that para-educators are the best use of Trustland money.

Additional Funds:

- Increase the number of para-educators for remediation and extension.
- Purchase curriculum, support materials/supplies, and manipulatives for Reading, Math, Science, or STEM.
- Cover costs of reading, math, and science computer software programs.
- Purchase headphones for computer software programs.

Adrianne agrees that headphones are needed. She has seen the need as she has substituted in classrooms this year.

The council agrees to the additional funding ideas above.
