### **Safe Routes Update**

- Safe walking route recommendations sent to the district
- Meeting with city

*Kim met with Vern Kessler, from the city a couple of weeks ago. He had not seen the council's recommendations, so Kim shared the list.*

- *Vern's feedback:*  
*The city will remove the school crosswalk from Jordan Ave. & 1460 and make it a pedestrian crossing. The city will also install yellow flashing lights and a digital speed sign this summer*
- *Provo City has a long-standing rule that speed bumps are not allowed. The speed bumps in the Carterville area are on the Orem City side.*
- *Bike lanes are not on the transportation list*
- *Roundabouts are allowed where north and south traffic is equal. Our suggestions do not fit under those guidelines.*
- *Speed limit will not be adjusted on 1460 North due to Collector Street.*

*The council discussed bringing up these concerns with the Neighborhood Councils to see if they can speak to the city about their concerns.*

### **Trustland Plan for the 2024-2025 School Year**

#### **Goals:**

- 80% of Kindergarten through 6th-Grade students will make typical or above progress on the Acadience Pathways of Progress (POP) End of the Year (EOY) assessment. The Acadience assessment helps teachers determine how students are performing on important reading skills. These critical reading skills include phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, and comprehension.
- Students in 3rd through 6th grade will increase their math scores by 3% as measured by the end-of-year RISE test data.
- Students in 4th through 6th grade will increase their science scores by 3% as measured by the end-of-year RISE test data.

**Funding Total:** \$93,839.72 for 2023-2024 school year

- Para-educators will provide remediation and extensions for our Kindergarten through 6th-grade students.

#### **Additional Funds:**

- Increase the number of para-educators for remediation and extension.
- Purchase curriculum, support materials/supplies, and manipulatives for Reading, Math, Science, or STEM.
- Cover costs of reading, math, and science computer software programs.
- Purchase headphones for computer software programs.
